



## Criteria for On-Campus Versus Off-Campus Services

It is felt that adding on-campus facilities and services are justified in the following situations:

1. Medical Offices with Land and/or Facilities Leased to Physicians
  - a Offices provided primarily for physicians who need quick access to the hospital on a frequent basis, often for medical emergencies.
  - b Offices provided primarily for physicians who perform high-risk procedures in the clinic setting, requiring close proximity to the hospital for reasons of patient safety.
2. Services Provided by Memorial
  - a Inpatient services.
  - b Outpatient services in which high-risk procedures are performed, requiring close proximity to the hospital for reasons of patient safety.
  - c Outpatient services which cross-utilize health care manpower with the acute care hospital or require close proximity to the hospital for other logistical reasons.
  - d Services which require an on-campus presence to provide direct support to the patient care programs and personnel of the acute care hospital.
  - e Other services which can be efficiently accommodated in available space which is primarily devoted to one of the purposes identified above.

Off-campus location should be considered in instances where one or more of the above criteria are not met.
